


Bishop Webb's 2013 Christmas Letter

BROCCOLI BAKE

Fran Young

1 ½ bunches of broccoli (I use 2 bags of frozen chopped broccoli)



Mix together:

2 cups sour cream 1 cup regular Miracle Whip

1 cup cream cheese 1 bag fine shredded sharp cheese

Stir cheese mixture with broccoli

Topping:

1 ½ sleeves Ritz crackers 1 ½ stick butter

Crumble crackers, mix into melted butter. Brown together until the crackers have absorbed butter. Sprinkle on top of broccoli mixture. Bake 375° for 30 to 40 minutes.

WHO WE ARE

"God created humanity in God's own image, male and female he created them." (Genesis 1:26-27)

We are persons created in the image of God. Simple enough. Paul, however, gives us a profound insight into the reality of who we are that frames our identity in a whole new paradigm. Paul writes in Ephesians, "Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has blessed us in Christ with every spiritual blessing in the heavenly places" (Eph. 1:3).

Do you habitually, regularly think of your life as being immersed in blessing? Just as a fish lives its life immersed in water, our lives are immersed in blessing.

If you are like me, you would probably answer, "Not all the time." You know there are those times when it certainly doesn't seem as though your life is immersed in blessing. Recovering from surgery. News that a loved-one has suddenly died. Being served papers that you are being sued for an automobile accident that your child had a few months ago. A cancerous lump on the back of your neck. Yet Paul is saying our lives are immersed in blessing.

Paul discovered that there is another order of being, there is another structure of life in which life, even life in a Roman dungeon, is immersed in blessing. Well now, that was probably true for Paul. After all, Paul was a rather important person in God's plan of things. He is the great apostle to the Gentiles. He wrote most of the New Testament. Paul is very significant; it makes sense that his life is immersed in blessing. But who am I? Paul continues in

Ephesians 1:4: Our lives are immersed in blessing "just as God chose us before the foundation of the world, that we should be holy and blameless before God in love."

We are not merely **chosen** out of the heart of God's love. We are chosen that we might be "holy and blameless before God in love." Our being (holy) and our doing (blameless) are to be the incarnation of a life lived in loving union with God. God's love indwells us to nurture us toward wholeness in loving union with God in Christ, **to enable us to be in the world those in whom Christ lives for others.** The question now is, "What do we need to do?"




