

HAMBURGER SOUP

Cindy Dutton

1 # hamburger, crumbled, browned in Dutch oven or soup pot, drained of fat

1 cup diced onion, sautéed with hamburger

Add:

6 cups water

1 cup diced raw potatoes

1 cup sliced carrots

½ cup diced celery

1 cup shredded cabbage (do not omit)

1 can diced tomatoes

¼ cup raw rice or barley

1 bay leaf

½ - 1 tsp. dried thyme leaves

¼ - ½ tsp. dried basil leaves

4 tsp. salt

¼ tsp. pepper



Bring to boil, then reduce heat and simmer 1 hour. Pass freshly grated sharp cheddar cheese to sprinkle on top of each bowl.

PROPHECY #25: Peace in Israel: The Seven Year Covenant



The history of the Jewish people is filled with everything but peace. In the Old Testament we read of wars between the Israelites and their heathen enemies. We read of wars between King David's sons who each wanted to rule David's kingdom. We read of Jewish men and women who could have lost their lives because of their faith... when foreign kings ruled over the Jews in their captivity. The hope of the Jews has always been in the promises for a better future... which God revealed in books of prophesy. But, things will get worse before they get better.

After the future formation of the Ten Nation Confederacy, and the rise of the World Leader... Israel will be given a seven year covenant of peace. (Daniel 9:27) Because the regathered nation of Israel will have no defenses at this time (such as walls surrounding their cities, or an army, or weapons)... the Covenant of Peace will be acceptable to it. Peace precedes the coming Great Tribulation. (1 Thessalonians 5:2-3) During the first 3 1/2 years of peace, the Jews will worship in their temple, and give sacrifices to God. But after the first 3 1/2 years, the Peace Covenant will be abruptly broken by the World (Leader) Dictator. He will stop Jewish offerings and sacrifices in the temple. He will put an idol of himself in the Jewish temple. This is called the "Abomination of Desolation." (Matthew 24:15-16) Then he will be revealed as the Anti-Christ. When people are forced to worship the idol (and, subsequently, the Anti-Christ, the Great Tribulation will begin. (Matthew 24:21-22) It will last for 3 1/2 years. (Revelation 13:5-6) Then Christ will return to earth to battle Satan.

God's prophesies in the past came true. (Such as the birth and death of Jesus.) His prophesies for the future will come true also.

PRESENT: Pastor Becky Worth, Gary Enderle, Judy Krott, Marshall Allen, Bernie Hawks, and Rob Cornell.

6:00 p.m. Rob Cornell called the meeting to order. Pastor Becky opened with prayer.

October 4, 2017, Minutes were read and discussed. Rob made a motion to accept the minutes as presented. Marshall seconded the motion, and all approved.

Treasurer's Report: Rob Cornell presented the Treasurer's Report and explained Trustee financials. Discussion followed. Marshall made a motion that the Trustees give the Memorial Committee suggestions on uses for \$1,000 worth of funds that are allocated to memorial projects. Judy seconded the motion, and all approved.

Discussion of Trustee Topics:

- *Marshall reported that the elevator was serviced.
- *The carpet and furniture in the pastor's study was cleaned.
- *The inside painting project will begin in a couple of weeks. Rob made a motion that we accept the two suggested paint color choices. Marshall seconded the motion, and all approved. Rob will contact the Boy Scouts and the violin teacher who use the church to give them instructions on how to enter while the painting is in progress.
- *Gary Enderle is coordinating the ramp project for Mark Middaugh's home. Gary has had discussion with the Office of the Aging and Grace United Church in Wellsville. Grace United has a ramp ministry group that builds/funds these projects.
- *Rob Cornell will connect the speakers and DVD in Wesley Hall.
- *Marshall will purchase another shelf for the High School Sunday School Room which will be used for the electronic equipment.
- *The pastor's desk chair needs to be replaced. Judy offered to go with Pastor Becky to Olean Standard Equipment to obtain a chair. Rob made a motion that a new chair be purchased for Pastor Becky. Marshall seconded the motion, and all approved.
- *A filing cabinet in the pastor's office was inadvertently locked, and we do not have a key to unlock it. Marshall made a motion that we obtain a replacement key. Rob seconded the motion, and all approved.
- *We discussed the computers/software used by Pastor Becky and Jim Travis. These really need to be updated. Rob offered to get a proposal on costs for these new computers and the necessary software. Gary made a motion that we accept Rob's offer to get a cost proposal for this equipment/software. Marshall seconded the motion, and all approved.
- *A suggestion was made to upgrade to LED light bulbs in the sanctuary. Further discussion will be held after the first of the year.
- *As a formal Nominations Committee is not in place, Gary Enderle and Bernie Hawks agreed to extend their terms as Trustees. We also discussed other potential Trustees. It was suggested that John Hupp be contacted to see if he is interested in serving as a Trustee. Marshall will contact John.
- *The next meeting will be held on December 6, 2017, at 6 p.m.

Marshall made a motion that the meeting be adjourned at 6:45 p.m. Rob seconded the motion, and all approved.

I visited many friends in the residential wings of Cuba Memorial Hospital this month. Some friends must have gone home, because I don't see them anymore. But there are new faces and new friends.

One lady is very busy. She has made hundreds of blankets with tied edges. The blankets are given to those in need... or sold to raise money for residents' activities. The lady smiles when she see me, so my master and I sit down for awhile and visit with her.

Two doors down the hall there is a man who likes to color pictures. Many are hanging on the walls of his room. He likes to pet me and calls me "Doggy".

Farther down the hall, there is a man who has an autographed picture of Dolly Parton on his wall. He says that he is from Tennessee, and that Dolly is a friend of his. The man has a restricted diet and talks about the fruit that he wished he could eat.

Sitting in the parlor area is a new lady. My master introduces us to her. The lady talks of her home. She would prefer to be there. She could only bring a few things with her, and she does not know anyone here. The lady likes to have someone to talk to.

A man (and his wife who was visiting him) were also sitting in the parlor area. He saw me from a distance and called us over. Her husband petted me while the lady spoke about the little dogs that they used to have.

Walking down the second hallway, we found a lady in her room. Last time we visited, she was confined to her room due to medical precautions. Now we went in, and I sat on her bed. That's the best! And she fed me dog treats!

A new couple has moved into a room near the end of the hall. Their daughter saw me and was excited. She wanted me to come into the room and see her parents. I did. They each petted me and smiled.

Before leaving the residential area, we saw a cleaning lady that my master said has been working there for as long as she could remember. My master said that the lady is always so kind to the residents. She talks with them, helps when she can, and gives hugs freely. My master knows that this lady is a Christian because she shows love to the less fortunate, just like Jesus did. There are never too many people to show the love of God. Jesus wants to love people through us.

Next week I will visit more new friends on the other floor of the residential wing. I will tell you about them too.


