1/4 tsp. garlic powder


1/4 cup margerine or butter (melted and cooled)

Churches in the area have reported scams. Texts have been received from the spammer, using a (716) area code number (there could be others), purporting to be from the pastor of the church with an immediate discreet need, requesting that the congregant purchase gift cards for a family experiencing cancer issues, that the cards will be picked up, and the congregant will be reimbursed. The text is addressed to the first name of the recipient, so it appears to be legitimate.

This type of spam also can occur with similar, but different scenarios and can be by email.

If you receive one of these scams, do not respond, and delete the text or email.

Holiday Assistance 2023

The Holiday Assistance program, sponsored by the Cuba Council of Churches, assisted 43 families which included over 100 children this year. In addition, three families who were not able to be served by the program were referred to the Cuba UMW for assistance. Generous contributions to the Food Pantry from you and others in the community allowed each family to receive three bags of groceries and a few families with a larger number of children received additional bags (up to 5)! Members of the congregation from Our Lady of Angels R.C Church contributed hats and mittens for the families to select as needed. The Toys for Kids campaign allowed for gifts of new toys and clothing. A charitable 'angel' provided new socks, slippers and other footwear that families could select if there was a need.

On December 6th, six community volunteers arrived at the Baptist Church to help prepare for the food distribution and arrangements of the tables/gifts in the fellowship hall. They then joined the 'bucket brigade' with the selected 5th grade students and school staff to help bring in the food contributions from the Cuba-Rushford School population. This food helped to supplement the packed bags of groceries, as well as beginning to restock the empty food pantry shelves. The well –mannered students were treated to hot chocolate donated by the Perfect Blend as well as home baked cookies. Because of a funeral in the Church sanctuary that Wednesday afternoon, the C-R middle/high school girls' cheer team members worked quickly and quietly to move the numbered packed bags from the stage area to the tables for distribution. They, too, were treated to some cookies.

On Thursday, Pastors Bill Beck and Jon Ward completed the paper work for the vouchers to Giant, Cuba Pharmacy and Family Dollar with the families as they came at their appointed times. "Ms. Santa Claus" and other helpers assisted families in carrying grocery bags and toy bags to their various transportation conveyances. Many hands working together helped 43 families have a merrier Christmas.
