REMOTE-STARTING THE CHURCH

Pray without ceasing.(1 Thessalonians 5:17)

For Christmas one year, our church gave us a remote starter for the gas fireplace in the parsonage. The idea was to stay seated in my lounge chair and start the fire by remote control. Many of us have remote controls for our televisions. Some even have remote starters for their cars.

Which has led me to wonder: How do we remote start the church? I have noticed many churches seem almost lifeless, and then suddenly they spring to life on some issue or some **ministry opportunity**. They have had worship and fellowship for years, their pastors have preached and served faithfully, and their laity have been loyal church members. But suddenly something happens and the whole church comes to life. How does that happen?


Wouldn't it be great to have a remote starter for our church? I have even fanaticized about sitting in my office and pushing some kind of remote starter and...presto! Our church would become more **alive and vital** than it had ever been!

From some of the conversations I have had, there must be a lot of you who believe that we pastors possess such a device. Unfortunately, if there is such a thing in my office, I have not yet located it.

Let me suggest an alternative. I believe that the Holy Spirit remote starts the church and that the "device" is **prayer**. Every church I know that has had an experience of sudden life or new birth has done so as a result of significant prayer by its pastor and lay leaders. It is through prayer that we make ourselves available to the power of God's Spirit to give our church (and us as individuals) the remote start that we need. Through prayer we provide an access for the Spirit to give us new life.

I **envision** our church having a *group of laity who pray for me* just before I lead the congregation in worship. I sometimes get inundated with announcements, last minute schedule changes, and other sorts of information overload before worship services begin. Not to mention a 30 – 45 minute drive, possibly in near white-out conditions. (Ah, January in Allegany County). These things make it difficult for me to be spiritually prepared to lead the services. Wouldn't it be great for a group of the laity of the church to gather me in a prayer circle and to ask God to empower me to lead you in worship?

I **envision** our church having a *prayer group that meets at least weekly* to pray for the concerns and needs of the church and community. It is important for this group to avoid being a gossip group, because then it could help remote-start God's healing presence in the lives of individuals and our church. These groups are usually stronger and more vital when they are led by laity and the pastor can attend as a participant. (continued on page 4)



CHERRY ICE BOX COOKIES

1 cup butter, softened

1 cup sugar

1 large egg

1 tsp. Vanilla

2 3/4 cups flour

1 tsp. baking powder

1/2 tsp salt

1 (16oz) jar maraschino cherries, drained and chopped fine


1 cup finely chopped nuts

1/4 c. red decorator sugar (optional)

Cream butter, gradually add sugar, then egg and vanilla, beating well. Combine dry ingredients and add to creamed mixture. Pat cherries between paper towels. Stir in cherries and nuts. Shape dough into two logs. Roll in decorator sugar. Wrap in wax paper and freeze for two hours. (could store in freezer for up to six months). Preheat oven to 400 degrees. Slice into 1/4" slices. Place on lightly greased baking sheet. Bake 8- 10 minutes. (Do

not let the dough thaw before slicing)


That's my **dream**. Every time I remote-start my TV I also pray for God's Spirit to remote-start me, you, and our church.
