Within the church, they were considered the most important. To get rid of such a controversial notion and to promote unity, Paul makes some assertions.

Notice what he says in 1 Corinthians 12:19-22, "<sup>19</sup> If they were all one part, where would the body be? <sup>20</sup> As it is, there are many parts, but one body. <sup>21</sup> The eye cannot say to the hand, "I don't need you!" And the head cannot say to the feet, "I don't need you!" <sup>22</sup> On the contrary, those parts of the body that seem to be weaker are indispensable"

Why? Because truthfully, if we all possessed the same talents, the same abilities, the same strengths and even weaknesses, where would the body be? The answer is simple. It would be lacking what **you** can contribute whether great or small. You see my friends; the truth of the matter remains steadfast. We need each other. Therefore, let us conclude that although you may not be able to do what others can; there is no gift given by God that is not both useful and beneficial to the growth and vitality of this congregation at Cuba United Methodist Church. 

### CHOCOLATE CHERRY CAKE Cindy Dutton

1 pkg Fudge cake mix

1 (21 oz) can cherrypie filling

1 tsp almond extract

2 eggs, beaten



Combine almond extract, cherries and eggs and carefully fold into dry cake mix. Spread in greased 10"x14" jelly roll pan. Bake at 350° 25 minutes, or 9"x13" pan for 30 minutes.

### SUNDAY ADULT BIBLE STUDY 9:45 am

In December the Adult Class discussed the following questions and searched scripture for answers:

- 1.) What is a "negative thought?"
- 2.) Are there any negative thoughts that aren't sinful?
- 3.) Where do negative thoughts come from?
- 4. ) What can we do about negative thoughts (to stop them)?
- 5.) Can a Christian feel close to Jesus if he/she is having negative thoughts?
- 6.) During the temptation of Jesus, Satan appealed: 1) to Jesus' hunger, 2) to Jesus' identity (as the Son of God), and 3) to Jesus' allegiance to God the Father. (Matthew 4:1-11)
- 7.) During the temptation of humans, Satan appeals: 1) to our physical needs (food, clothing, housing), 2) to whether our faith (or lack of faith) is sufficient for us, and 3) to whether people would rather have some heartache and suffering (while depending on God/Jesus) or whether people would rather have entertainment and gratification (money, status, sex) without salvation and heaven.
- 8.) What difference (in our lives) does faith in Jesus make (in our living, in our giving, in our language, and in our thinking?)
- 9.) Have you ever said, "the devil made me do it"? Is that true?
- 10.) Have you ever thought, "I am not respected/appreciated/highly educated/well salaried."? Why? Can this problem be fixed?
- 11.) Have you ever thought, "I am unpopular/fat/ugly/lazy/stupid/under valued/unlovable."? Why? Can this problem be fixed?
- 12.) Do we ever: hate, criticize, boast, gossip, swear, hit, hurt?
- 13.) Do we practice: stealing; occult; extra marital or premarital sex; selfishness; pornography; unforgiveness; disrespect; self indulgence (alcohol, tobacco, vaping, food, gambling). Why?
- 14.) Where do bad actions come from? What action can we take?
- 15.) Temptations (which have negative connotations) may lead to sin... or death... or even to spiritual death.
