Palm Sunday

On Palm Sunday Christians celebrate the triumphal entry of Jesus Christ into Jerusalem, the week before his death and resurrection. For many Christian churches, Palm Sunday, often referred to as "Passion Sunday," marks the beginning of Holy Week, which concludes on Easter Sunday.

Palm branches are mentioned in only one of the four Gospels (John 12: 12-15). So why do we call the first day of Holy Week Palm Sunday?

Tradition plays an important part in church history. During Jesus' time, Rome was the world's leading power. Whenever the Romans were victorious in battle, citizens traditionally threw palm branches in the returning heroes' path.

The Bible revels that when Jesus entered Jerusalem, the crowds greeted him by waving palm branches and covering his path with palm branches. Immediately following this great time of celebration in the ministry of Jesus, he begins his journey to the cross.

This was the accepted custom of reception. So when Jesus rode into Jerusalem, it was appropriate that he receive a hero's welcome. One week later, he would be victorious over death.

Please remember: The Lenten Luncheons are every Wednesday at noon through 4/4. The Lenten Bible Study is every Wednesday evening at 6:00 pm. until Completion of Max Lucado's book "He Chose the Nails: What God Did to Win Your Heart." All are welcome to attend.

Easter is the sacred celebration of Christ's resurrection from the dead. It is the oldest and holiest Christian festival, the climax and center of the liturgical year, and the holy day to which all other holy days point. Even denominations that do not strictly follow a liturgical calendar commemorate Easter with tremendous joy and thanksgiving.

The Cuba United Methodist Church celebrates by bringing fresh flowers to put on our life-sized, oak Cross to celebrate new life. Many many thanks to Fred Pearce for crafting this beautiful cross for us.

Sandy is Mac & Cheese Queen

Our own Chef Sandy Tsujimoto was the 2nd place winner of the Cuba Cheese Shoppe's annual Mac & Cheese contest on Saturday, March 10th. She has graciously agreed to share her recipe.

Double-Cheese Macaroni

Prep 25 minutes Bake 20 minutes Yields 12 servings (1 cup each)

1 16 oz pkg of elbow macaroni

3 cups cottage cheese (Shur-fine or Friendship)

1/2 cup butter

1 tsp salt

1/2 tsp pepper

1/4 tsp garlic salt

3 cups half n half cream

1 cup milk

4 cups shredded cheddar (I use 2 cups extra sharp Cuba Cheese and 2 cups sharp Cuba Cheese)

Topping:

Crushed crackers with melted butter

Cook macaroni. In large saucepan, melt butter. Stir in flour, salt, pepper and garlic salt until smooth. Gradually add cream and milk. Bring to boil; cook and stir until thickened. Add 4 cups of shredded cheese gradually until melted. Pour mixture into cooked macaroni. After placing

topping on mixture, bake at 375 degrees for 20-25 minutes. Do not cover while heating. Enjoy!!!
