From Pastor

Then Jesus came to them and said, "All authority in heaven and earth has been given to me. Therefore, go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age." (Matthew 28:18-20)

This has been my favorite Scripture text since seminary. It is called the Great Commission that Jesus gives to all his disciples (you and me). What is God saying or doing to us in the Great Commission? I hear God calling all of us to three tasks:

- 1. Go make disciples. This we call **evangelism**. The church exists to communicate God's Word to the whole world. We can start in our own community.
- 2. Baptize them. Why is baptism so important? I believe it is that through baptism one is made a part of the Body of Christ (the church). It is also a symbol of salvation and a very clear means of God's grace in one's life. It says, "This person is now one of us!" It is **fellowship.**
- 3. Teach them to obey everything Jesus has taught. This we call **discipleship.** The church exists to educate and spiritually form God's people. Discipleship is the process of helping people become more like Christ In their thoughts, feelings, and actions. We all need help in becoming more like Christ, as well as helping others in their journey.

You shall..."Love the Lord your God with all your heart, soul, and mind. This is the first and greatest commandment. The second most important is similar: Love your neighbor as much as you love yourself." (Matthew 22:37-39)

Note that in the Great Commandment loving God and loving our neighbor are equally "most important." They can't be separated in the life of a Christian. What is God saying to us in the Great Commandment? Again through Jesus Christ, we are assigned two more tasks:

1. Love the Lord with all our hearts. This we call **worship**. Throughout Scripture we are commanded to celebrate God's presence by magnifying the Lord and exalting God's name. We should be expressing our love to God with our will, feelings, intellect, even our bodies.

2. Love your neighbor as yourself. This we call **ministry**. Ministry is meeting others needs and healing their hurts. The church is to minister to all kinds of needs: Spiritual, emotional, relational, and physical. Healthy ministry is balanced between ministry to our brothers and sisters in the church AND our neighbors outside the church.

He said to them: "It is not for you to know the times or dates the Father has set by his own authority. But, you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." (Acts 1:7-8)

Where do you find yourself as a witness to Jesus Christ? Where is the Jerusalem / Judea / Samaria / ends of the earth in which you reach out with the love of Christ? Perhaps our community is our Jerusalem (Cuba Village and Township). I have been appointed to two Jerusalem's: Cuba and Friendship Townships, including the villages. Yet I also witness to Christ in all of Allegany County (our Judea?) Perhaps New York State beyond Western New York is our Samaria. I think or "the ends of the earth" as everywhere else.

#### Conclusion:

- Our church's purpose is **outreach** on Christ's behalf.
- Our church's character should be about **love** of God and one another.
- Our church's concerns run from **Cuba** to the **whole world**.

Our devotional time included a brief Bible study of the above texts. We will be providing leadership to three shared ministry events/activities with Friendship UMC:

We decided to introduce the congregation to the needs of CMH in order to explore the congregation's interest in CMH as a unique ministry focus.

Pastor Tim reported that the Confirmation Program was canceled as only one youth could commit to participating. He and Jennie will be preparing that youth for baptism on Easter Sunday.

#### EAGLE'S WINGS

In Isaiah 40, we are told that by waiting upon the Lord, we will mount on wings like eagles.

Eagles are majestic birds with remarkable vision. Scientists believe their vision may be eight times sharper than humans. They have powerful feet with talons that can grip like a vise. Their beaks are butcher-like, designed to cut and crush and tear their food.

Most of all, eagles are built for flying. They have incredible speed, able to fly at sixty and eighty and one hundred miles an hour. They can do rolls and loops like an airplane doing tricks. Their wingspan extends to nearly eight feet.

But eagles do not fly like sparrows or robins. Most birds fly through the air by flapping their wings, but eagles cannot flap very long. They're built for soaring, and so they can go much further in little energy.

God created our planet with invisible columns of hot air called **thermals** rising up here and there from the surface of the earth. Eagles find these thermals, fly into the invisible currents, stretch out their wings, and are lifted higher and higher into the sky as though ascending on an elevator.

They may rise as high as fourteen thousand feet, so high in the heavens they cannot be seen by the naked eye from earth.

When they reach those heights, they emerge from the updraft, wings still spread, and they soar this way and that way, downwards and side wards, traveling for miles with very little exertion of strength.

Isaiah seems to be telling us that God is invisible, but like the invisible uplifting thermal currents of this planet, he is present for us. When we search God out, claim God's promises and trust in God, spreading out the wings of faith, we are raised up to a higher plain. We mount up with wings like eagles. We can run and not grow weary. We can walk and not grow faint.

The strength we need for holy, effective, Christian living comes not from anxiously flapping our wings like sparrows in distress, but from trusting in God and resting in Jesus Christ.
