

Ask yourself a few questions like these. How many Sunday worship services would have to be canceled if everyone attended church as regularly as I do? How many Bible classes would the church have if everyone attended them just like me? Would the members of the church have a good understanding of the Bible or would they have trouble finding the book of Psalms?

Would there be an ample supply of Sunday School teachers if everyone were just like me? Would there be plenty of people to serve on committees, to make calls on prospects or shut-ins? Would the church lawn be cut regularly, the church cleaned weekly? Would the church budget be met, and the bills paid? Would there be strong support for missions if everyone supported the church just like me?

Would our hypothetical church be a friendly church which welcomed others into its midst, or would we keep to ourselves? Would we embrace all who came through the door with the same love and enthusiasm? Would we treat the affluent in the same way as those who were poor? Would we welcome only those whose children were well behaved, who were nicely dressed and caused no disturbance? Would we show love and forgiveness to all when they did something to offend us? Would we be there to support the pastor in his ministry or only be there to criticize?

"What kind of church would my church be, if everyone were just like me?" Would the church have revival, or be struggling for survival? Try to ask yourself this question regularly. It will help you keep things in perspective. If everyone were just like me, there would be some areas where we would shine. But I also know there would be many areas where the church would be wanting.

Thank God that each member of the church is not exactly the same. We all have our strengths and weaknesses. Thank God that there are people who make up for those areas in which we fall short. Let us each ask God to forgive us for our sins and short-comings and ask for help to do better in the future. Let us strive to be more and more like Jesus for what a church it would be if every member where just like him.

THE HISTORY OF LENT

The Christian Lent has Hebrew roots. It is related to Annual Jewish Passover Festival which commemorates the beginning of the deliverance of the Hebrews from bondage in Egypt around 1300 B.C. (Exodus 12).



At that time, God went throughout Egypt killing all the firstborn of people and animals but 'passing over' and sparing those of the Hebrews whose houses were marked by blotches of lamb or goat blood on the doorposts and lintels. This was the beginning of new life for the Hebrews. Dating back to well before the time of Christ, the Jews have appropriately celebrated Passover in the early spring, which heralds the beginning of new life in nature.

Similarly, Lent for Christians is a season of release from bondage of sin in preparation for Easter that is the beginning of new life in Christ. Just as with the Hebrews, we commemorate Lent and the beginning of Easter season appropriately in early Spring, which is symbolic of new life.




LAZY DAY STEW Deb Battistoni

- 2 pounds beef cubes
- 2 cups carrots, sliced
- 2 cups potatoes, diced
- 2 medium onions, sliced
- 1 cup celery, chopped
- 1 ½ cup green beans
- 2 tsp quick tapioca
- 1 tsp salt
- ½ tsp pepper
- 1 8 once can tomato sauce
- 1 cup water
- 1 TBS brown sugar

Place raw beef cubes (do not brown) in a single layer in a 2 ½ quart casserole or roaster pan. Add vegetables and any other you desire. Sprinkle tapioca, salt and pepper over the top. Pour tomato sauce mixed with water over vegetables and seasonings. Crumble brown sugar over all. Cover tightly and do not peek! Bake at 325° for 3 hours.








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SUNDAY ADULT BIBLE STUDY 9:45 am

DUDLEY TAILS

Misunderstanding is the root of conflict.

Dudley and Tucker were waiting for me to go downstairs. Sometimes they waited impatiently. Sometimes they sat and watched my every move. And, sometimes, they laid down... closed their eyes... and simply gave up.

After what must have seemed like an eternity, Dudley heard me say, "let's go downstairs." Dudley sprang up, and ran toward the doorway where Tucker was still laying down with his eyes closed. Thump! Dudley ran into Tucker! It was a very unexpected collision for Tucker who jumped up and snapped at Dudley. The unexpected confrontation by Tucker made Dudley jump back in bewilderment. Tucker had misunderstood Dudley's intent, and it led to a confrontation.

Tucker would not intentionally hurt Dudley... but, being startled awake, Tucker probably thought that some animal was trying to hurt him. This incident reminded me of a conflict (about 4½ years ago) when Dudley was almost one year old and Tucker was about six years old.

My husband and I had packed up the van with food, water, clothing, maps and two dogs. We were heading from our home in Allegany County (NYS), to Silverdale (in Washington state). We were going to visit our adult son who had taken a job out there. After about six days, we arrived at his house, and saw him and his dog in the doorway.

The dog (named Ying) was a former pal of Tucker's. Ying had been adopted by our son about a month after we had adopted Tucker. Both dogs barked, recognized each other and immediately ran inside to play. Dudley barked too, but it was not because he wanted to play... but because this other dog (that he did not know) had run inside with Tucker.

Dudley was a little nervous when we went indoors. I sat down and put Dudley on my lap while we all visited. Dudley watched as Tucker and Ying jumped around, barked, and chased each other. Then, all of a sudden, Dudley jumped off my lap, ran directly at Ying, and tried to bite the back of his leg. Ying quickly turned, and chased Dudley back to where he had been previously sitting. (After the adults finally settled down), it was clear that the dogs had decided to keep a safe distance between each other. Dudley had misunderstood Ying's intent, and it led to a confrontation.

There are times when people too, misunderstand someone else's intention. There are times when our words or actions are misunderstood by another person. This may lead to conflict. It may lead to a break in a friendship. Are we supposed to avoid that person and not speak to that person?

We may not have been guilty of an offence. Or... they might not been guilty of an offense. But... by not talking to that person, or by avoiding that person, the problem does not get resolved. And the relationship is not mended. And God is not pleased.

In the New Testament we are told that, "if we are giving our offering in church, but then we remember that someone has something against us... we should leave our gift at church... and first go and be reconciled to that person. Then go back and offer your gift (to God). (Matthew 5:23, paraphrased). Are we able to do what our Master wants - to forgive or be forgiven?
