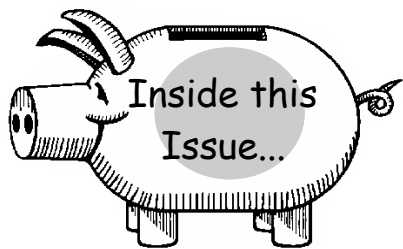

## Bishop Webb's Easter Message

But the angel said to the women, 'Do not be afraid; I know you are looking for Jesus who was crucified. He is not here; for he has been raised, as he said. Come see the place where he lay. Then go quickly and tell his disciples, He has been raised from the dead' ..." (Matthew 28:5-7)

This is the good news of our faith. This is the good news for our world! Jesus is alive. Jesus defeated sin and death, and because Jesus lives, we too can know the fullness of life offered by God. During the 40 days of Lent, we have examined our lives, examined the ministry of Jesus and have made our way, once again, to the cross and the work of forgiveness and salvation found in that ultimate act of sacrifice. While the cross is vital in our faith and theology, the work of the cross is completed in the reality of the empty tomb. We are a forgiven people; we are a saved people, AND we are people of resurrection.

What does it mean to be a people of resurrection?

One of the many online dictionaries defines resurrection in this way:

1. The act of rising from the dead or returning to life.
2. The state of one who has returned to life.
3. The act of bringing back to practice, notice, or use; revival.

People of resurrection are people who by faith in Jesus Christ receive the promise that sin and death no longer have power. The barriers are gone, not because of something we have done or not done, but because of what Jesus has done! God's amazing grace led Jesus to the cross and propelled Jesus from the grave. The power that brought Jesus back to life is available to us – it brings our spiritually dead selves back to life! People of resurrection allow the reality of the empty tomb to become the reality within their lives.



People of resurrection are people who go quickly into the world and share the hope of life with others. As we celebrate the resurrection of Jesus, we must choose to allow the power and truth of the resurrection to move us from a celebration of faith to a revival of faith. Resurrection transforms us SO THAT we may be used in God's work of transforming the world.

You see, a true Easter faith, a true response to the empty tomb, is found in allowing our lives to be renewed, revived and changed in such a way that we become relevant within the world and boldly proclaim to others the truth, reality and power of resurrection!

The world is filled with despair, hopelessness, suffering and injustice. The message of the resurrection offers something different, something new. Those who claim to be people of the resurrection have a vital task, a great commission of making sure that the message of hope, justice and life is spoken and lived louder than any other message.

As we celebrate another Easter, may we wrestle with the question of what it means to be a people of resurrection. May God empower us to more fully live the reality of who we are – for our sake and for the sake of the world around us.

Jesus is alive! Let's join Him in living the life offered, because the tomb is empty!

Christ is risen! Christ is risen indeed! Happy Easter!

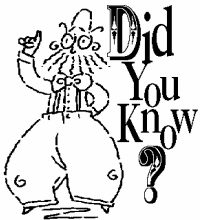

## EASY ORANGE ROLLS

Cindy Dutton

Unroll an 11 oz. Can of French bread dough. Pat flat.

Mix together:

4 oz. cream cheese

1/4 cup brown sugar

2 tsp. orange zest

Spread on bread, leaving 3/4 inch border.

Roll up. Cut 10-11 slices about 1-1/4 inches wide.

Place cut side down in greased 8" round pan.

Bake 25-30 minutes at 375 degrees.

While warm, drizzle with 1/4 cup powdered sugar mixed with 1 Tbsp. orange juice.

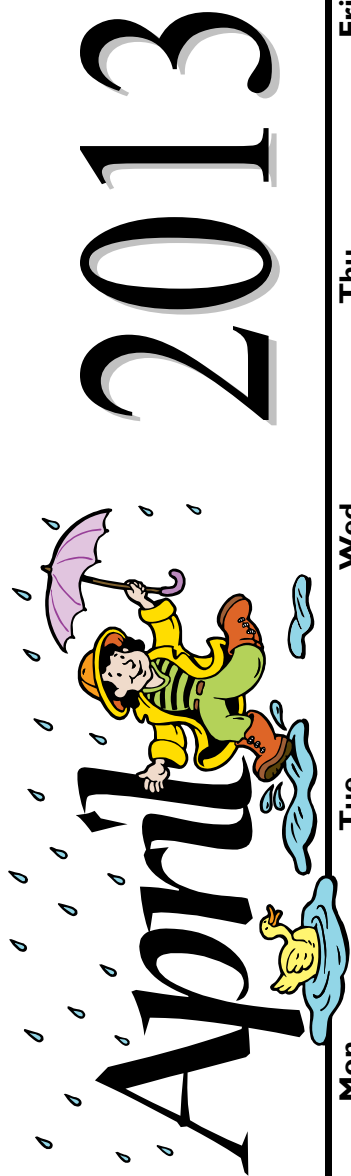
◆ Josh Enderle was also honored at the awards dinner for academic achievements and commitment to the community through volunteer activities and projects.
