
The UMW met on March 8th with brunch provided by Barbara and Judy.

TATER DIPPED VEGGIES Sue Simmons

- 1 cup instant potato flakes
- ¹/₂ tsp. celery salt
- 1/3 cup greated Parmesan cheese
- ¹/₄ tsp. garlic powder

¹/₄ cup margerine or butter (melted and cooled) 2 eggs

4-5 cups raw bite size veggies. (mushrooms, peppers, zuccini, carrots, parboiled broccoli and cauliflower)

Combine potato flakes, cheese, celery salt, garlic powder and butter. In another bowl, beat eggs. Dip veggies into egg mixture, then potato mixture. Coat well. Put on ungreased baking sheet. Bake at 400° for 25 minutes. Serve with ranch dip.


