KNOWING JESUS AS THE GOOD SHEPHERD & SHARING THE RISEN CHRIST WITH ALL.

THREE KEY RELATIONSHIPS

"My prayer is not for them alone. I pray also for those who believe in me through their message, that all of them may be one, just as you are in me and I am in you. May they also be in us so that the world may believe that you have sent me. I have given them the glory that you gave me, that they may be one as we are one: I in them and you in me. May they be brought to complete unity that the world may know that you sent me and you have loved them even as you have loved me." – John 1:20-23

Jesus came to earth to provide a way for each of us to have a personal relationship with god. Here, in what is called Jesus' High Priestly Prayer, we see Jesus praying his deepest desires on the night before he is to die on the cross for his prayer is about our ability to have loving relationships with God, himself, and each other. When we combine the desires with Jesus' commandment "to go make disciples" we discover **3 Key Relationships**:

- 1. Our relationship to **Christ**. <u>Humbling ourselves</u> to God by admitting <u>we</u> <u>need Christ</u> in our life to forgive our sin and live God's way. A <u>commitment to learn and grow</u> in this relationship. Embrace a <u>desire to discover and do the will of God</u>. As a church, it can be easier to love activity, the status quo, or a religious reputation more than God. Spiritually healthy Christians and churches have a passion for knowing God, becoming what God wants them to become, and for doing what God wants them to do.
- 2. Our relationship with **one another**. Friendships, <u>fellowship</u>, and fun. <u>Praying</u> for each other. <u>Responding</u> to each other's needs. Healthy Christians and churches are characterized by a high degree of caring of members for each other and for outsiders.

ABOUT LENT AND HOLY WEEK WORSHIP

The Great Three Days from sunset Holy Thursday through sunset Easter Day are the climax of Lent (and of the whole Christian year) and a bridge into the Easter Season. These days proclaim the paschal mystery of Jesus Christ's passion, death, and resurrection. During these days, we journey with Jesus from the upper room, to the cross, to the tomb, and to the garden. These days are actually a great unified service beginning with Holy Communion on Maundy Thursday and concluding with the services on Easter Day.

The Easter Season, known as the Great Fifty Days, begins at sunset Easter Eve and continues through the day of Pentecost. It is the most joyous and celebrative season of the Christian year. It focuses on Christ's resurrection and ascension and on the givings of the Holy Spirit on the first Easter (John 20:22-23) and the day of Pentecost (Acts 2). During this season some of our youth and children will be baptized, adding to our joy and celebration.




SPRINGTIME OF THE SPIRIT





Course Descriptions

LAY SERVANT MINISTRIES - BASIC COURSE

This course is the foundation for all the other Learning and Leading courses. In this course you are encouraged to discover and employ personal spiritual gifts as God intended. Participants are invited to consider the importance of exercising servant leadership, developing future leaders, remaining rooted in their discipleship. The course offers guidelines for best practices as a church leader and in mission and ministry in the community and in daily life. Participants must obtain the book, "Lay Servant Ministries BASIC COURSE" by Sandy Zeigler Jackson and Brian Jackson - leader Nancy Preston

TRANSFORMING EVANGELISM:

Traditional views of evangelism are often intimidating and push the limits of personal comfort, leaving the job of reaching out to new and searching Christians for the professionals - the clergy of the church. Knight and Powe show how this basic misunderstanding is contrary to John Wesley's view of evangelism, which he understood as a complete circle. The key to Wesley's way of sharing the faith is to relate to others in love, compassion and gratitude for God's divine grace. Participants must obtain the book, "Transforming Evangelism" by Henry H Knight III and F. Douglas Powe Jr. - leader Susan Hardy

Course Descriptions

UNITED METHODIST POLITY

Both laypeople and clergy are often confused and even frustrated by those questions and more. This class will help newcomers to the U.M.C. get their bearings and longtime members consider the specific structural challenges the church faces in the 21st Century. Participants must obtain the book, ""Polity, Practice and the Mission of the United Methodist Church" (2006 edition) by Thomas Edward Frank, and the 2012 "United Methodist Book of Discipline." - Leader Pastor Suzanne Block

LAY SERVANT LEADING WORSHIP:

This advanced course in Lay Servant Ministries focuses on the ministry of the Lay Servant who either regularly or occasionally leads a group, class, organization, or the congregation in worship. The course is grounded in the classic patterns of Christian worship and the practices of leading worship. Participants will come to understand more about Christian worship in order to lead worship with more confidence. They will practice leading worship in a variety of formats throughout the course. Participants must obtain the book, "Worshiping with United Methodists Revised Edition A Guide for Pastors and Church Leaders" by Hoyt L. Hickman - leader Pastor Tim Gleason


