Mission Central at work:

I am a volunteer with the American Foundation for Children with AIDS, based out of Harw risburg, PA. In addition to sending life-saving medicine, we also send 4 or 5 cargo containers full of medical supplies and equipment to our partner clinics in Africa each year. Mission Central is one of our biggest suppliers of medical supplies. I make the trip to Mission Central in Mechanicsburg about once a month to pick up hospital beds, adult diapers,

sterile operating drapes, crutches, canes, wheel chairs, potty-seats and orthopedic supplies. Ray Harden and Jean Norris know what AFCA needs and these items are held for us until the time when I can come to pick them up. These two people are our 'eyes and ears on the inside' for AFCA. Last summer, a doctor's office closed down and all of the supplies ended up at Mission Central. There must have been over 150 boxes of supplies. I received a call that these items were up for grabs so I arrived at Mission Central the very next day, gathering the things most useful to AFCA. What makes this situation so special is this came at a time when AFCA was desperate for supplies and we were thinking about postponing the next container. However, due to Mission Central's flood of supplies, we were able to send that container right on schedule. As always, God's timing is perfect!"


### **Dudley Tales**

### **Adult Sunday School Studies** with Cheryl

Prophesy # 5: The savior will be a descendant of Abraham

Adult Sunday School

Many people today enjoying tracing their ancestry. They like to know who they have descended from. The Jewish people kept very detailed records of their history. The priests had to have a pure ancestry dating back to the first priest: Aaron, (the brother of Moses). And, Jewish lines were to remain "pure". (Jews should only marry Jews.) It is not unusual then, that the promised Savior would trace his lineage all the way back to Abraham.

God had told <u>Abraham</u>, "All peoples on earth will be blessed through you." (Gen. 12:13) This referred to the coming Savior who would be a blessing to the world. Abraham finally had a son with Sarah in his old age. They named him Isaac.

When <u>Isaac</u> grew up, God said to him, "through your offspring all nations on earth will be blessed." (Gen. 26:4-5) Isaac married Rebecca and they had twins. So the godly line continued.

<u>Jacob</u> was the younger twin and Esau was the older, but because God had said, "the older will serve the younger," (Gen. 25:23)... God chose Jacob and said, "all peoples on earth will be blessed through you and your offspring." (Gen. 28:146) Jacob was renamed, "Israel".

<u>Judah</u> was one of the Twelve Tribes (sons) of Israel (Jacob). When his father gave a prophesy to each of these sons, he told Judah that, "The scepter will not depart from Judah nor the ruler's staff... until (Christ) comes (to whom it belongs.)" (Gen. 49:10). Judah was chosen to be in the lineage that led to Christ Jesus. Judah's offspring would pass down the lineage of a king and ruler until the true king and ruler until the true king and ruler of the world would appear.

This godly lineage eventually led to David (shepherd boy, slayer of Goliath, musician, psalmist, warrior and second king of the Jewish nation.) God promised David that he would always have a descendant upon the throne. (2 Sam. 7:16). Eventually it would be Christ.

<u>Solomon</u> was David's son who became the third king of the united Jewish nation. God blessed him with wisdom and riches for years. But because of his sin, (in later life) his sons fought over who would be the next king. Soon the kingdom was divided, and eventually the Jews were defeated by their enemies, and taken away from the Promised Land. Solomon's lineage eventually led to Joseph, (earthly father of Jesus.)

<u>Joseph</u> provided the legal title for Jesus in his lineage. However <u>Nathan</u>, (another son of David,) was the ancestor of Mary (the mother of Jesus). Because <u>Mary</u> physically carried and birthed Jesus... his physical claim to the throne of David (and also to being the Messiah) came through Mary.

The Jews had looked for their Messiah and Savior for generations. Yet they did not believe who he was when he came. Jesus fulfilled the prophesy.

So, the prophesy of the savior being the descendant of Abraham was literal, and the prophesy came true.

Sue, Doris & Shirley furnished refreshments. Thela opened meeting with a Prayer Were 11 ladies in attendance.


- Shirley read Minutes of last meeting. Ruth gave the Treasuries Report, Have \$2026.83, plus \$156 to be deposited.
