What Is the Purpose of Worship?

Why do we gather every Sunday, sit on wooden pews, stand up, sit down, sing songs, listen to a

person talk for 25 minutes, eat a little piece of bread dipped in grape juice, and then give away our money? Why in the world would we spend precious time on a Sunday morning doing these things when we could be doing something productive?

Too often, worship is seen as "the thing you do" on Sunday because that's what you've always done. But worship done well is more than just an event to attend; it's a transformative experience, a period of time where God breaks into our lives to reveal something new to us about God and about ourselves.

So, let me say what my understanding of the purpose of worship is for Cuba United Methodist Church. But first, let me say what worship is NOT. One of the purposes of worship is not "to get your needs met." In our consumerist culture, that's an unspoken expectation we bring with us each Sunday. If we sing an unfamiliar hymn or the sermon falls flat, we feel like we've been let down. We are used to sending back meals that aren't cooked properly in restaurants or returning items to the store that don't meet our needs, so why should worship be any different? The somewhat funny but unspoken demand behind those feelings is, "Hey, I'm paying for this, it better be good!" But worship isn't about us; it's about God.

Therefore, I believe worship has two primary purposes. The first is praise. Worship is a time for us to come into God's presence and offer thanksgiving to God for all of our blessings, including the blessing of God being with us during our difficult times. It's a time to look around, see all the ways God is present with us, and then to tell God "thank you" through songs (even unfamiliar ones) and prayers and offering. In worship, you are not the audience. God is the audience and we are the actors, so one reason we come to worship is to "perform" our gratitude for God.

EASY ORANGE ROLLS

Unroll an 11 oz. can of French bread dough. Pat Flat.



Mix together:

4 oz. cream cheese

½ cup brown sugar

2 tsp. orange zest

Spread on bread, leaving ¾ inch border.

Roll up. Cut 10-11 slices about 1¹/₄ inches wide. Place cut side down in greased 8" round pan. Bake 25-30 minutes at 375°. While warm, drizzle with ¹/₄ cup powdered sugar mixed with 1 Tbsp. orange juice.

COUNCIL OF CHURCHES NEWS



SUNDAY ADULT BIBLE STUDY 9:45 am

This past month the Adult Class:

- 1. Watched the DVD: "The Great Deceiver". This is another name for Satan who is not a small red creature with a pointed tail, and carrying a pitchfork. Various theologians tell what the Bible says about Satan, and where to find the passages in scripture. We are told that, "Satan's approach is straight forward, and his objective is final: to separate every man, woman and child from God, using any means necessary." The presentation includes interviews with ordinary people who relate their stories about spiritual warfare. 49 minutes.
- 2. Watched the DVD: "Stephen's Test of Faith". Twelve year-old Stephen takes his grandfather's Bible to school for use in a classroom presentation. He is mocked and ridiculed for his faith, and discards the Bible. That night, Stephen dreams of traveling through history. He meets Jesus, Stephen the martyr, Christian families who were thrown into the Roman Coliseum, William Tyndale (who translated the Bible into newer languages), and others who share their faith, Stephen's view of the kingdom and his definition of "Christian" are broadened and clarified. Stephen finds his grandfather's Bible, and is now strong enough to witness to his world. 22 min.
- 3. Studied "The Whole Armor of God," which is explained in Ephesians 6:10-18a. The correlation between each piece of spiritual armor and what purpose it serves for Spiritual Warfare was discussed.
- 4. Were shown ten books that are recommended Christian reading. Topics included: death, afterlife, heaven, hell, eternal destiny, miraculous answers to prayer, questions about suffering and evil, miracles in the ER, and true stories of children's encounters with angels, miracles and God. The second purpose of worship is call. In the course of a week, it's easy to lose sight of who we are, to lose our connection to the One who grounds us in our identity as God's children. So, worship is a time to quiet the noise around us and listen again for God's voice, as God calls us to go out into the world and be God's light in the darkness. God not only calls us but equips us with bread and cup, tangible reminders of the sacrificial lengths to which God has gone to show us we are loved. That divine love is so abundant that it should overflow from us to others, and worship reminds us of the call to share God's love.

The next time you're in worship, I hope you'll think about praise and call. How will you praise God on Sunday? How will you hear God's call to you in that specific time and place? And how will you respond to it? Even if the sermon falls flat - which we all know it will, at least from time to time - I want you to remember this: It's not about you. **It's about God.**

DUDLEY TAILS

Beep! Beep! Beep! The urgent noise woke me up from a warm slumber.

Beep! Beep! Beep! So insistent. So compelling.

Beep! Beep! Will it ever stop?

Then a light came on in the hall, and I heard my husband coming up the stairs.

Beep! Beep! What time was it? 5 am! 'Still dark. I realized that the loud urgent noise was our smoke alarm sounding off. Oh! Where was Dudley? He must be afraid. (Dudley no longer slept in his dog crate. He could be in any of the three rooms upstairs.)

Beep! Beep! Beep! The threat was unsettling. Where would Dudley go if he was afraid? I quickly ran some answers through my head.

Beep! Beep! Beep! My husband was locating a stool (to stand on) to reach the smoke alarm.

Of course! I think I know where Dudley is! Slowly I put my hand down, over the edge of the bed. I reached around, and soon felt soft fur and floppy ears. Immediately I felt a warm, wet tongue licking my hand. Dudley had found me!

The smoke alarm was disabled... and peace had returned to the cold winter night. Soon our air purifier would remove the smoke that had risen from the wood furnace in our basement.

Dudley stayed near, and was comforted by his master's presence. His confidence returned, and he again felt secure.

Unexpected alarms sometimes cause distress for us too. We may be alarmed on a cold winter day when our car doesn't start. We may be alarmed when our spouse or child has an accident, and must go to the Emergency Room. We may be alarmed when our bill for taxes is much higher than we expected. Many things can cause us to be alarmed, and even afraid. King David said to God, "when I am afraid, I will trust in you." (Psalm 56:3) We can follow his example.

When Dudley was alarmed, he sought release from his anxiety. People do this also. Sometimes we just can't get through a threatening experience without help. When the psalmist sought help for the cause of his anxiety, his Master told him to, "be still and know that I am God." (Psalm 46:10) Our Master tells us to calm down, because He is in charge, and His power can accomplish many things.

Dudley went to his master in his time of need and found protection and strength. We also, do not like to go through difficult times alone. We need the presence of our Master to calm and strengthen us. The psalmist testified that, "God is our refuge and strength, an ever present help in trouble. Therefore we will not fear..." (Psalm 46:1-2)

When we are alone, or afraid, or anxious, our Master is our refuge. He invited us to come to Him. It is there that we will find calm for our fears, peace for our anxiety, and love for our longing.
