Be sure to attend on April 17th at 11:00 am and invite a friend to attend with you!





FRENCH TOAST WITH PEACHES

1 cup brown sugar ½ cup butter

2 TBS. water 1-29 oz. can sliced peaches, drained

5 eggs 1 TBS. vanilla

Pinch of cinnamon 12-(¾ inch) slices day old French bread



In a saucepan, stir together the brown sugar, butter and water. Bring to a boil, then reduce heat to low and simmer for 10 minutes, stirring frequently. Pour the brown sugar mixture into a 9x13" baking dish, and tilt the dish to cover the entire bottom. Place peaches in a layer over the sugar coating, then top with slices of bread. In a medium bowl, whisk together the eggs and vanilla. Slowly pour over the bread slices to coat evenly. Sprinkle cinnamon over the top. Cover and refrigerate for 8 hours or overnight. Remove the dish from the refrigerator about 30 minutes before baking to bring to room temperature. Bake at 350° for 25 to 30 minutes, or until the bread is golden brown. Spoon out portions to serve.

Through the glass door, the winter weather looked windy and cold. The birdfeeder swung back and forth, as sparrows and cardinals tried to stop by for lunch. The flower pot that had been forgotten last fall, sat quietly on the deck... covered in a five inch blanket of snow.

Dudley was curious as he watched the birds in the snow, through the glass. He would like to run out there and scatter the birds all directions... but the door was closed, and no one inside wanted to open it.

COUNCIL OF CHURCHES NEWS

The Cuba Council of Churches met on March 13th at the First

Baptist Church. Theresa Heinz joined the meeting to discuss the possibility of church walking tours being part of the Cuba Bicentennial celebration. Several possible dates were discussed and the weekend of July 15 and 16 chosen. Many details have yet to be worked out, but in general, Council members agreed to move forward with the idea.

Assistance was provided in February: four food requests from the Pantry and one gasoline request. At this time the Pantry needs include: cereal, jam/jelly, boxed meals (i.e. Hamburger Helper, etc.), snack items (i.e. crackers, etc.) personal care items (i.e. toothpaste, deodorant, etc.), cleaning supplies (i.e. dish soap, etc.) and paper towels.

Bill Beck will coordinate the Easter video wherein participants from each church record the same scripture that will, in turn, be compiled into one short video.

Church representatives shared information from their congregations:

- Christ Episcopal—The first in-person service since reopening was held on March 13 with the Rev. Michael McCune, a supply priest from Greece, NY. The church will continue in-person services the second and fourth Sundays through April.
- Cuba First Baptist—Summer programming has begun.
- North Park Wesleyan—Easter activities include the April 16 "Eggstravaganza" and a drama on Easter Sunday.
- Our Lady of Angels—Father Dennis Mancuso has responsibility for St. Mary Byzantine Church in Olean as well as the Catholic parishes. Some parishioners at that church have family in Ukraine.

The next meeting of the Council is Sunday, May 15 at Cuba United Methodist Church.

Perfect Love

In his book Written in Blood, Robert Coleman tells the story of a little boy whose sister needed a blood transfusion. The doctor had explained that she had the same disease the boy had recovered from two years earlier. Her only chance for recovery was a transfusion from someone who had previously conquered the disease. Since the two children had the same rare blood type, the boy was the ideal donor.

"Would you give your blood to Mary?" the doctor asked.

Johnny hesitated. His lower lip started to tremble. Then he smiled and said, "Sure, for my sister."

Soon the two children were wheeled into the hospital room—Mary, pale and thin; Johnny, robust and healthy. Neither spoke, but when their met, Johnny grinned. As the nurse inserted the needle into his arm, Johnny's smile faded. He watched the blood flow through the tube.

With the ordeal almost over, his voice slightly shaky, broke the silence. "Doctor, when do I die?" Only then did the doctor realize why Johnny had hesitated, why his lip had trembled when he'd agreed to donate his blood. He'd thought giving his blood to his sister meant giving up his life. In that brief moment, he'd made his great decision.

Johnny, fortunately, didn't have to die to save his sister. Each of us however, has a condition more serious than Mary's, and it required Jesus to give not just his blood, but his life.
