HOW TO GET TO KNOW YOUR PASTOR

Getting to know your pastor can help you get more out of church and can help you give more of yourself through the church.

As your pastor, I play an important role in the daily life of our congregation and the community. Despite my churchy profession, fancy robes, and knowledge of Greek and Hebrew, I experience the same kinds of ups and downs as everyone else. I value efforts to meet, connect with, and support me. Some ideas to get to know me:

My Cuba people can **connect with me after worship by shaking my hand.**Offering a comment about the sermon, readings, or hymns lets me know that my worship planning time is appreciated. My Friendship people will need to find other ways to make the connection.

Pray daily for me, because I don't just work on Sunday. I have many responsibilities, like visiting members in the hospital, writing sermons, and figuring out who can provide music for worship. In your prayers, ask God to grant me health, strength, and wisdom to face the many challenges of leading a congregation.

Ask me to share with you why I entered this form of ministry. There are many reasons why a pastor may have enrolled in seminary to become an ordained or licensed minister. Be prepared for a story that may surprise you.

Stop by my office to talk, or consider making an appointment to get to know me. I welcome the opportunity to connect with church members at times other than worship. As you would with any drop-in visit, be sensitive to the fact that I may be quite busy. A scheduled appointment just to chat could provide a welcome break in my day.

There will be an Ice-cream Social at 10:30 am for the kids.





HAM DELIGHTS Cindy Dutton

Blend:

1 Stick butter and 1 stick margarine

1 TBS. Worcestershire sauce

1 med. Onion, chopped

3 TBS. Poppy seeds

3 TBS. Dijon mustard

Split 3 pkgs. (1 doz. each) Pepperidge Farm party rolls, or similar (leave rolls connected as you slice all at once horizontally). Spread top and bottom with butter blend.

Place on rolls:

1 Lb. good quality deli ham, thinly sliced or shredded 1/3 lbs Swiss cheese slices

Wrap in foil. Bake 10 min. at 400°. Makes 36 lunch or appetizer rolls.
