

Have you ever skipped a meal? Maybe your day was too busy or you simply forgot to stop and eat. It really affects you, doesn't it? You start to feel weak, irritable and tired the longer you go without food because you need it for your body to function properly. This is something that happens all the time spiritually. In Matthew 6:11, in the middle of the Lord's Prayer, Jesus teaches us to pray for our daily bread when

He says, "Give us this day our daily bread." Is He referring to our provision? Yes, but I think He's talking about more than just our natural, physical provision. Throughout the Old and New Testament, many Scriptures refer to the Word of God as bread. So, with that in mind, is it possible that Jesus is telling us to pray every day for a word from God—for our daily bread?

I *fully* believe God has a word for you every day and that word will strengthen and nourish you all day long. However, there are a lot of Christians who are weak and tired because they aren't getting their daily bread from His Word. They're going weeks and months without eating what's readily available to them. God cares for us like a shepherd cares for his sheep, and He's provided us with the nourishment we need—but it's up to us to actually eat it.

When you start reading the Bible every day, God will speak to you through it. He'll encourage you and prepare you for situations you're going to encounter each day. Sometimes a word you get in your daily reading can provide nourishment for someone else, too. I can't tell you how many times I find myself talking to someone, and when they start to tell me about what they're going through, I'll remember, "That's what I read about this morning!" Then I can use that word to encourage and speak life to them. You never know when God is going to speak a word to you that will change your life or the life of someone around you.

What's God's word for *you* today?





COOL CUCUMBER PASTA SALAD

Kathy Isaac (Doris Wyant's family)

8 oz. uncooked penne pasta 2 medium cucumbers, thinly sliced 1-½ cups sugar ¾ cup white vinegar 1 TBS. dried parsley flakes 1 tsp. pepper

1 TBS. vegetable oil 1 medium onion, thinly sliced 1 cup water 1 TBS. prepared mustard 1 tsp. salt ½ tsp. garlic salt



Cook pasta according to package directions, drain and rinse in cold water. Place pasta in a large bowl, stir in the oil, cucumbers and onions.


In a jar with a tight lid, combine the remaining ingredients. Shake well. Pour over salad, toss to coat. Cover and chill for 4 hours, stirring occasionally. Serve with a slotted spoon. Refrigerate leftovers. Yield: 8 to 10 servings.

37 Major Bible Prophesies

PROPHESY #30: Armageddon (location for the battle of Good vs. Evil)

Previous to this prophesy, we were told about the Great Tribulation which included pain, suffering and death for mankind and also the destruction of earth by a severe earthquake that split the city into three parts. This is also referred to as God "pouring out" judgments on the earth. (Revelation 16:1-21) Also 100 lb. hailstones will fall.

Now comes the Final World War (at Armageddon) which will be located in the Holy Land, north of Palestine. East of Mount Megiddo, in a broad valley, Jesus will battle Satan for control of the earth. (Revelation 16:16) Satan, the Anti Christ, and the False Prophet will gather kings and armies to fight on their side. (The kings will actually be fighting for their own power and superiority.) Jesus will gather the armies from heaven to fight on His side. (Revelation 19:11-15a)

Satan and his followers will surround Jerusalem, but before the troops can do anything, they will be devoured by fire from heaven. Then Satan will be thrown into the lake of burning sulfur, and be tormented for ever and ever. (Revelation 20:7-10)

Thus, the Battle at Armageddon will be won by Jesus and the forces of Good. Punishment will be received by Satan and the forces of Evil.

Prophesies have come true in the past. They will come true in the future also.

Soon we will be going to visit residents at Cuba Memorial. There are new faces there again with new names. But some familiar faces have not been there in weeks. One face that has been missing is my friend Bob.

Bob has a thick mustache and glasses. I first met him last year. He was reclining in a chair in his room. My master introduced us and said that we visit

the residents every week. Bob said that he would like us to visit him. He was very enthusiastic and wanted to hold me and pet me. At first I was a bit cautious.
