

There was one family who simply can't get to church or Sunday School on time so they just stopped coming and then were upset that the Sunday School was changed. Remember the saying that was all the rage here a few years ago; "It takes a village to raise a child"? Well, it is my contention that "it takes the whole family of Cuba UMC to grow the church. "We all have an



We sponsored a coffee hour this year with a cake.




