





More than 5,500 Boy Scouts and their adult leaders attended United Methodist worship at the National Jamboree, held at Fort A.P. Hill. It was part of a strong United Methodist presence at the event, which celebrated the centennial of Boy Scouts of America. Larry Coppock, the national director of Scouting ministries for the Commission on United Methodist Men, reported that during the Jamboree about 5,200 commemorative New Testaments and 10,000 Nothing but Nets patches were distributed. The worship service offering totaled more than \$12,000. Along with the money collected at the Nothing But Nets display, the scouting event raised more than \$17,000 to the church's anti-malaria partnership.

#### Revised May 2010

It is the time of year when weddings are on the calendar. Some time ago I had indicated to the SPRC that I would be revising the policies of the church on the use of the facilities for such events as well as setting some policies of my own in regards to notice and other issues. In today's society most couples have the tendency to book the reception hall well before they check with the church or the pastor. For the most part I have tried to accommodate those requests but after consultation with colleagues and some conflicts with scheduling issues, that will be changing.

The following are my policies and they include the requirements from the United Methodist Discipline

- 1. The church and the pastor must be contacted at least nine (9) months before the desired date of the wedding. There will be only FEW exceptions to that requirement. Those exceptions will be entirely at the discretion of the pastor.
- 2. The Book of Discipline requires "at least" 6 sessions of Pre-Marital Counseling. Should issues come up in those sessions the Pastor has the ability to require more sessions or professional counseling and as always the authority to refuse the wedding.
- 3. Alcohol should never be a part of the wedding or the rehearsal. Should the pastor smell any alcohol on anyone in the wedding party during rehearsal or on the day of the wedding, the wedding will be summarily cancelled. There is NO negotiation on this point. Sobriety is a must when entering into a lifetime commitment of this nature.
- 4. The fellowship hall may be used for the reception with the notation again that there will be no alcohol whatsoever involved. The cost of the hall is \$100.00 to cover cleaning costs. Decorations may be used but the wedding party is responsible for removing those decorations following the service.
- 5. Use of the church for the wedding only will be 100.00. Again to cover cleaning costs. There will be nothing attached to the walls in the sanctuary.
- 6. Video and still photography will be permitted. The Photographer will need to speak to the pastor as to the restrictions of camera placement and flash photos. The couple will be responsible for employing the photographer.
- 7. If the church organist is expected to play for the wedding there will be a charge of \$50 that covers both the rehearsal time and the wedding. The couple will work with the organist in picking out the music for the service. Under no circumstances will the organist be expected to purchase music for the service.

The charges of the pastor will be worked out at the time of counseling.

It is our desire to make your wedding day as memorable as possible and to help you invited God into your marriage. May God bless you and keep you as you travel this road together.
