
TIME CHANGE!!

Dear Cuba Friends in Christ,

My wife Jennie and I are blessed to have been so graciously received and warmly welcomed into your community of faith. As many of you know, we have moved to Allegany County from Findley Lake, where I served as pastor of the only church in the hamlet. Prior to that appointment, I served as pastor of Oswego First UMC.

I have been in pastoral ministry for seventeen years in New York state and the West Ohio Conference. I hold a Master of Divinity Degree from MTSO, a Master of Education degree from



the George Washington University, and a Bachelor of Biological Sciences degree from the State University of New York at Buffalo. I was ordained a Deacon in the United Methodist Church in 2000, and an Elder in 2003.

As a pastor, I enjoy teaching and preaching, organizing and equipping laity for ministry, and providing spiritual guidance and leadership to my people. Perhaps the most challenging aspect of my ministry with you will be dividing my time between Cuba and our sister congregation in Fillmore, 26 miles away. I am also finding hospital visits challenging - from Olean to Rochester.

Along with pastoral ministry, my passions include Boy Scouting and the Free and Accepted Masons. Prior to responding to God's call to be a pastor, I served as an executive with the Boy Scouts of America and have been a volunteer leader throughout my pastoral career. In 2011 I was honored to receive the Masonic Scouter Award. I have been an active Mason for almost 20 years and served as Master of a lodge.

Jennie and I were not blessed with children, but our two cats get into plenty of mischief. We enjoy camping, hiking, and swimming. We also enjoy spending time at Jennie's parent's cottage at Silver Lake.

I plan on working three days a week in Cuba and two in Fillmore. I do keep a Sabbath every week - it will most likely be on Saturdays.

I do have two bad habits: Eating too much and driving a bit too fast. Please don't share that with the State Police.

Jennie and I are excited about serving the Lord with you in Allegany County and look forward to getting to know each of you.

He holds a Bachelor's Degree from Shippensburg University and a Master of Divinity Degree from Asbury Theological Seminary Webb has served as pastor for United Methodist Churches in Wormleysburg, Pa and Mechanicsburg, Pa. New Bishops may not be assigned to the area where they were a clergy member. The upper New York Conference covers most of New York State except the New York City area. It is divided into nine districts, ours being the Cornerstone District.
