More Than Money

When you think of the word "tithe," what's the first thing that comes to your mind? Most people probably think of money, but it actually has little to do with money. For God, tithing is an issue of the heart. Genesis 4:3–5 tells the story of Cain and Abel bringing their offerings to the Lord, and it gives us a lot of insight into what God is looking at when we give: "And in the process of time it came to pass that Cain brought an offering of the fruit of the ground to the Lord. Abel also brought of the firstborn of his flock and of their fat. And the Lord respected Abel and his offering, but He did not respect Cain and his offering. And Cain was very angry, and his countenance fell."

People have wondered for years why God respected Abel's offering and not Cain's. The Word makes it clear the offering Abel brought was the firstborn of his flock, but it doesn't say Cain brought the firstfruits of his crops. In fact, it says, "and in the process of time." In other words, Cain grew his crops and then, "in the process of time," got around to bringing an offering to the Lord. The implication is that he didn't bring his firstfruits to the Lord. Could that be why God did not respect Cain's offering? I believe so. Abel, on the other hand, brought the firstborn of his flock to the Lord, and God accepted his offering.

Here's the lesson for us: God is looking at our hearts when we give. And when we give the first of our firstfruits, or our tithe, God receives and respects that offering because it takes a lot of faith to give to God before we pay our mortgage, our car payment, or the IRS.

There was much more at stake than money when Abraham offered his firstborn son, Isaac, to the Lord (Genesis 22). Abraham didn't wait to see if he had 10 sons before he gave his first one. Nor did God go to Abraham when he only had Isaac and say, "After you have four or five more sons, I'm going to come to you and ask you for one of them." No, God asked for the first when one was all he had! Abraham only had the promise of having more sons. It took faith for Abraham to offer Isaac. And faith is precisely what tithing requires. It's giving God the first, in faith. Many people say they're putting God first, but true tithing is where the rubber meets the road. It's where we walk what we talk. It's also one of the ways God blesses and protects us.

When Satan comes against you with fear and says, "You're going to go broke, your marriage is going to fail, you're going to get a disease," you can firmly reply, "No, I'm a tither, and because I tithe, the Bible says that God will rebuke the devourer for my sake. Yes, for my sake! God is first in my life, and God is going to redeem and protect everything else in my life!" Putting God first in our lives is what tithing is all about. It's not about money; it's about revealing the state of our hearts.

God, thank You for blessing me with everything I have. Help me to understand Your heart for tithing, and give me the faith to give You the first of my increase. In Jesus' name, Amen.

Our studies this year should prove to be an exciting time of looking ahead to our future life beyond this earth. And, it will be a testament to the incredible love of Jesus.


Come. Join our fellowship! Let's learn more about the spirit within us! Meet at 9:45 am in the church sanctuary on Sunday, September 9th.



PROPHESY #33: Judgements at the Second Coming





When Satan gathers his supporters to wag war at Armageddon, the armies and their leaders will be judged. It will happen in an instant. Jesus will say the word, and the earthly armies (and even their horses) will be killed. (Revelation 19:17-19)

The World Ruler and his Associate will be judged. For their evil campaign to rule the earth (with power and hate) they will be thrown into the "fiery lake of burning Sulphur." (Revelation 19:20)

Satan will be judged. For his desire to be worshipped like God, Satan will be bound with a chain and thrown into the Abyss (home of the demon world) during Christ's 1,000 year rule on earth. (Revelation 20:1-3)

Old Testament persons who have died, will be judged. After they have been raised from the dead, "some will awake to everlasting life, others..." (Daniel 12:2)

At the Second Coming, those Israelites who are alive will face purging judgements. These will determine which Jews will enter the Millennial Kingdom. Who of them is prepared? (Matthew 25:1-13) Who will receive a reward? (Matthew 25:14-27)

At the Second Coming, those Gentiles who are alive will be judged. (During the Great Tribulation, there will be Anti-Semitism. Gentiles who help and befriend the persecuted Jews will show their trust in Jesus.) The Gentiles who are selfish will be "lost". (Matthew 25:31-46)

At the end of the 1,000 years of Jesus' rule, the children who were born during that time will be judged. Have they become true believers? Is Jesus their Savior?



PROPHESY #34: The Millennial Kingdom: Restoration of Israel

After the Second Coming of Jesus to earth, and the Battle of Armageddon, the Millennial (1,000 year) kingdom is established and Israel is restored. The "king of the Jews" becomes in control of a renovated earth, and brings new standards: righteousness,

peace and prosperity.

Jesus (as the king of kings) will assume the throne of David and reign (from Jerusalem) over the entire earth. (<u>Isaiah 2:4</u>) (<u>Psalms 2:6-9</u>) Christ's reign will be just. (<u>Psalms 72:1-2, 11-14</u>) Peace will exist for all.

The "Restoration of Israel" refers to the fact that the Jews will return (from all over the world) to their Promised Land. (Ezekiel 39:25-29) It also indicates a spiritual restoration for the Jews because Christ's reign will be the literal fulfillment of God's promises to King David. (Jeremiah 23:5-6)

Spiritual Life during the Millennium will have, as its foundation, knowledge of the person and work of Christ. Christ will be the object of worship and obedience. His glory will be visible. Also present will be the indwelling of the Holy Spirit... giving believers joy and peace. (Ezekiel 36:27)

The larger Millennial Temple will assure believers that God is in their midst. (Ezekiel 43:4-5)

Social and economic life during the Millennium will include: equalization of wealth, prosperity in material things and in justice, health and long life. The "Curse of Adam" will be lifted and the earth will no longer produce thorns, thistles, and weeds. (<u>Isaiah 30:23-24</u>) Man will not have to toil with great strength to grow things and woman will not have pain in childbearing.

At the end of the Millennium, Satan will be loosed and he will attempt (unsuccessfully) to capture Jerusalem. (Revelation 20:7-10) He will be judged and thrown into the Lake of Fire for eternity.


