

SWEET & SOUR PORK SAUSAGE BALLS Sue Simmons

Meatballs: 1 pound bulk pork sausage 1 slightly beaten egg

1/3 cup fine bread crumbs

½ tsp sage

Sauce:

½ cup catsup 2 TBS brown sugar

1 TSB vinegar

1 TBS soy sauce



Mix sausage, egg, bread crumbs and sage. Shape into about 2 dozen 1 ½" balls. In ungreased skillet, brown balls slowly on all sides, about 15 minutes. Pour off grease. Prepare sauce and pour over meatballs. Cover and simmer 30 minutes, stirring occasionally to coat meatballs. Make smaller meatballs if using them as appetizers.

Another Successful Rummage Sale (albeit the final one....)

For decades, the United Methodist Women have run rummage sales, and this year was not an exception. Our three day sale netted over \$1,050 along with a generous donation. It was 3 weeks of work, working around our family commitments and tired knees and backs, but it's always fun to watch the people waiting patiently for the doors to open the first day and heading downstairs to see what goodies we have.

I remember my early days helping many decades ago. Zelda would have cookie sheets with bits of masking tape all marked with prices of 5 and 10 cents, and every item that was for sale had a price tag on it! After the sale, the ladies would carefully pack up what didn't sell, and they would save them for the next sale 6 months later.

Later, Virginia and I became the Rummage Queens. We still did 2 sales a year, but we simplified by having set pricing on clothing items. We still marked every kitchen and domestic item.

Probably about 4 years ago we got to the point of 1 sale a year, and went to a by the bag sale – you fill it for \$5, \$3, or \$2, depending on what day you shopped.

This years sale would not have been successful without all the generous donations of saleable goods.

The Kung Fu Group – Paul, Rob, Deneen, and John, set up the tables and helped carry out the totes for us to unpack! The bulk of setting up Wesley Hall, the choir area, and 3 Sunday School rooms was done by Fred and Peggy, Holly, Claire, Thela and myself. We got help selling from Janet, Lew and Ruth, Linda, Sue, and Marilyn along with us that set up.

It's sad that we had to decide that the end had come – but we have helped many charities and local families from our efforts.

The CROP Walk provides an opportunity to serve others who lack sufficient food or have other needs. Everyone can participate by choosing to walk or to sponsor a walker. Walking requires just a one hour commitment of walking at your own pace on the streets encom-
