

The following is a story of nature demonstrating the fact that struggles are a necessary part of growth and development for the Christian in this life. God places

these struggles (or trials) before us to prepare us for that perfect home in heaven with Him.

The Man and The Cocoon

One day a small opening appeared on a cocoon. A man sat and watched for the butterfly for several hours as it struggled to force its body through that little hole. Then it seemed to stop making any progress. It appeared as if it had gotten as far as it could and could go no further. The man decided to help the butterfly, so he took a pair of scissors and snipped off the remaining bit of the cocoon. The butterfly then emerged easily but it had a swollen body and small, shriveled wings. The man continued to watch the butterfly because he expected that, at any moment, the wings would enlarge and expand to be able to support the body, which would contract in time. Neither happened! In fact, the butterfly spent the rest of its life crawling around with a swollen body and shriveled wings. It was never able to fly.

What the man in his kindness and haste did not understand was that the restraining cocoon and the struggle required for the butterfly to get through the tiny opening was God's way of forcing fluid from the body of the butterfly into its wings so that it would be ready for flight once it achieved its freedom from the cocoon.

As Christians, struggles (or trials) are exactly what we need in our life in order to grow and develop properly. If God allowed us to go through our Christian life without any obstacles, it would cripple us spiritually. We, like the butterfly, would not be as strong as what we could have been. We could never fly!

Friends-Let's thank God for our daily struggles (trials) and display the same attitude toward trials as the Apostle Paul. The great Apostle said in 1 Peter 4:12-13,

¹² Dear friends, do not be surprised at the fiery ordeal that has come on you to test you, as though something strange were happening to you. ¹³ But rejoice inasmuch as you participate in the sufferings of Christ, so that you may be overjoyed when his glory is revealed.



1 cup shortening, margarine or butter

2 cups sugar

Add:

2 eggs ½ cup molasses

1 tsp. maple flavoring

Mix and Add:

4 cups flour

½ tsp salt

2 tsp cinnamon

1 tsp cloves

1 tsp ginger

4 tsp baking soda



Mix all. Dough will be stiff. Chill. Roll into walnut-sized balls. Roll in granulated sugar. Bake at 350° for 8-10 minutes.

DUDLEY TAILS

He stood at attention. 'Eyes straight ahead. 'Feet planted and immoveable on the floor. 'Ears perked and alert. 'legs ready to ready to run when the time was right.

It was Dudley, standing at the open glass door. Across the grass was a neighbor dog, who was intruding on our lawn. Dudley braced himself. 'Short, little front legs were ready to go. Longer back legs were ready to push off and propel him closer to his goal.

"Dudley, DON'T! Brown Dog will head home in a minute. He is not challenging you."

But no. Brown Dog trotted toward our house. Dudley took off like a shot, barking as loud as he could. It didn't matter that Brown Dog was three times bigger than Dudley. And Dudley had not thought about what would have happened if Brown Dog had gotten angry. The two of them would have had a confrontation

The situation was similar to a small child running into the street to retrieve a ball, and not being aware of the danger presented by an oncoming car. A parent must spring into action to rescue the child. Dudley's master had prepared.

Dudley was fortunate that he was on the inside of the fence in his yard, and Brown Dog was on the outside. But, what would happen sometime if Dudley was on the outside of the fence? Dudley must learn to <u>listen</u> to his master's voice, <u>and</u> choose to <u>obey</u>.

Another time, Dudley was walking freely in a large old hay field. He and his master would start out together. Then Dudley would follow an interesting scent and his master would get ahead of him. Soon Dudley, running at top speed, would pass his master and be out of reach. Dudley disappeared into the weeds that were taller than he was. His master called his name, but Dudley could not be seen. His master walked faster, again calling Dudley's name. No response. Was Dudley listening? No. There he was up ahead, coming out of the old hay field. Was he so absorbed in following a scent, that he didn't hear his master call? Or did he choose to do only what he wanted to do?

One evening when Dudley and his master were finishing their walk, and heading back to the house, a neighbor (returning home from work) stopped at her mailbox which was on the edge of the road. She got out of her car. Dudley saw her, and began to bark as he sped toward the mailbox. But he didn't stop there. Dudley ran into the road and circled the car.

Dudley would not come when he was called, and would not leave the road. He liked our neighbor, and may have been thinking that it was okay to be in the road, because he was greeting a friend. (Dudley was fortunate that he lived on a country road that didn't have much traffic.) Dudley's master was not pleased with his disobedience.

When Christians make a commitment to Jesus... it is not a decision that they can violate when it is not convenient, or that they can ignore when they want to do something unchristian.

In the Bible, Jesus often refers to his followers as his sheep. And, He is the shepherd. It is implied that sheep often make mistakes, and need the guidance and protection of their shepherd.

Dudley had been taught at an early age, but sometimes it is as if he doesn't care anymore. As if he wants to do only what he choses to do. And, sometimes it is as if he does not even hear his master's voice.

The Bible tells us, in the book of John, (Chapter ten and verse 27) that Jesus says, "my sheep listen to my voice." How can people listen to what the Master is saying if they don't even hear His voice? The voice of our Lord is more important than the voices of our world.


"God has given us the greatest Gift of all—His Son, who died on the cross and rose again so that we can know Him personally and spend eternity with Him in heaven."
