"It is He who saved us and chose us for his holy work, not because we deserved it but because that was his plan." (2 Timothy 1:9)

By the end of the third quarter of 2012 Mission Central had been blessed with more than 6,000 volunteers who donated almost 18,000 hours "for his holy work." This is the equivalent of 12 additional full time employees at a cost savings of almost \$130,000! Our volunteers are clearly one of God's bountiful blessings.

October saw almost 125,000 lives touched by Mission Central, with more than 2 million people assisted by the \$7,344,000 worth of resources we have disbursed from this building this year. Of the \$3,433,000 disbursed by Mission Central in 2012, 66% of the resources have gone overseas, 8% have remained within Pennsylvania, and the remaining 26% have been shipped elsewhere in the United States. These percentages are likely to shift significantly as we prepare to distribute Cleaning Buckets and Health Kits to our neighbors who have been impacted by Hurricane Sandy. October's interactions included medical shipments of feeding supplement; seasonal items, activity kits and candy for outreach programs; and items for Haiti, Sierra Leone, India and Guatemala. "

The Administrative Council met on November 13th after the Finance Committee. It was good to hear that the change to a part time pastor has helped bring some financial solvency to our church. We are glad to be able to meet expenses and pay the bills.

Judy had compiled a spreadsheet from the surveys that were turned in which made it a little easier to come to some conclusions about what the congregation is thinking and expecting from the CUMC. The committee reviewed the surveys and the compilation.

Some interesting facts:

We had 23 responses to the survey. The average age of the members was 41 to 60+. The average membership was either 20+ years or 6-20 years. Most responded that they would like more familiar music **and a choir**. I believe we have already taken care of the familiar music situation. Now, please pray for a choir director. I know we have some really good voices. We need a leader.

A common theme throughout the surveys was that we need more children. Unfortunately, we probably don't have young families because we don't have local business and jobs to support them. We need to think about outreach and ministering to our community.

There was a unanimous "Great Job" response for Sandy Tsujimoto with the Summer Shenanigans program. Thank you, Thank you, Thank you Sandy!
