God walked in Eden (Gen. 3:8). He came to Moses in a burning bush (Exodus 3:6). He led the people of Israel out of Egypt as a pillar of cloud by day and a pillar of fire by night (Exodus 13:21). He literally sat on top of the ark of the covenant between the two cherubim (1 Sam. 4:4). 



#### **DOUBLE CHOCOLATE BROWNIES** Cindy Dutton 1 stick butter, melted in saucepan 1 cup semisweet chocolate chips — melt with butter, stirring constantly Recipe Remove from heat. Stir in: uba UMC Cook Book 1 cup sugar 1 tsp vanilla 3 eggs Mix together and stir in: $1 \frac{1}{4}$ cup flour <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> tsp baking powder $\frac{1}{2}$ tsp salt Add remaining 1 cup chocolate chips. Dudley was now five years old.

He had:

- grown through a fun-filled puppyhood with his siblings....
- experienced the trauma of being taken from his mother....
- adapted to a new home with a new location....
- learned to recognize his new master, and "the family dog" who was older than he was....
- he had experienced new and exciting things....
- he had grown to appreciate more of creation, and more of his larger world.

Dudley felt comfortable — pleased with his new surroundings and with his new life. He loved his master, and was obedient to his master's call. Dudley knew, and responded to, his master's voice.

This 15 lb, 12" high (at the shoulder) dog was always excited to have his master's attention, and provisions. Dudley showed his loyalty to his master. Dudley defended his master. And, Dudley did not want to ever be separated from his master.

Dudley's master loved him deeply. There was not much, that Dudley's master would not do for him. But — there was a line that Dudley was not allowed to cross. It included things like:

- 1. Dudley should never respond to any request from someone pretending to be his master.
- 2. Dudley should never elevate anything above his master. That includes not listening to false masters who would pretend to love him, but only use him their own benefit.
- 3. Dudley should be enticed away, by any offers of false affection, or by toys, or by the offer of a tempting food or tempting activity.
- 4. Dudley should not turn against his rightful master, for any reason. He must trust and obey.
- 5. Dudley should take time to rest, and take time to just, "be in the presence of his master."
- 6. Dudley should remember his parents, and should not stray from what they taught him.
- 7. Dudley should not recklessly kill other forms of life without cause.

Shouldn't people respond in similar ways toward their master?

These seven statements are the Seven Commandments for dogs. Why? Not because the master wants to restrict his faithful friend... but because the master wants to protect him.

Likewise... when God gave mankind the Ten Commandments... it was to protect us. (See Exodus 20, verses 3-17) Now think:

- 1st Command: What would it be like with many gods, each demanding different things from us? (verse 3)
- 2nd Command: Would we want our children and grandchildren to be punished for the wrong that we (verses 4-6) commit?
- 3rd Command: How many times would we be guilty of wrongly using God's name? (in a week? a year?) (verse 7)


4th Command: Remember the Sabbath day, by keeping it holy. How many days, weeks, years have we (verses 8-11) been guilty of not going to church?

- 5th Command: How can we best honor our fathers and mothers? (verse 12)
- 6th Command: What things would lead us to commit murder? (verse 13)
- 7th Command: Are humans too weak to control their actions? (verse 14)
- 8th Command: What causes someone to steal? Need? Desire? Challenge? Do people no longer believe in judgement?
- 9th Command: Why do people lie about what others do, or don't do? If God says lying is wrong... Why do it? (verse 16)
- 10th Command: Why do people think they need what others have? Shouldn't we see that we already have (verse 17) more than many people do? What should we desire instead?

God loves us more than we can ever love Him. Our Christmas gift from God is His Son, Jesus, our Savior.
