There is something unique about the Season of Advent. For example, imagine being a faithful Jew 2,000 years ago. For thousands of years your people prayed to God for deliverance. God told you that a Messiah, the Christ, would come to save you. You believe God's promise and you wait, and you wait, and you wait for that day to come. You pray, and you pray, and you pray for that day to come. There were probably many times you would have thought God forgot about you, or that maybe God changed His mind. The season of Advent is unique. It is a season of longing. Advent is a time when our prayers focus upon that First coming of Jesus as well as the Second coming of Jesus. Like the Jews of thousands of years ago, we can also pray for the Christ to come, but this time to come again. In many ways, we are more blessed than the Jews of thousands of years ago. We are more blessed because we have much more than a promise; we have the promise's fulfillment in Jesus. Do we still wait? Of course, we do!

Do we still wrestle with our daily lives and in tears sometimes cry to God? Of course, and that will not change in this life. But what has changed is this - you actually get to hold your Deliverer in your hands every time you have the Lord's Supper and be reassured your deliverance has come. You have Jesus. Advent is a time to long for Jesus to return again and to redeem all of heaven and earth. This is God's promise to you. He fulfilled this promise in Christ and one day, you will see it with your own two eyes when He returns again. Until that day comes, may our hearts always pray, "O Come, O Come, Emmanuel and ransom captive Israel."

The Green Street foyer provided a warm, welcoming space for the November 11th meeting of the United Methodist Women. Seven ladies were present.

The successful rummage sale brought in about \$1,525 for the group, and this, plus the existing balance in the treasury, allowed the group to make the following Christmas donations: \$200 to Henderson Settlement and \$150 to Toys for Kids. In addition, the group decided to follow the guidelines set last year in assisting local families: gift cards to Giant and Walmart. The group plans to help three to four families with these gifts.

COUNCIL OF CHURCHES NEWS

Members of the Cuba Council of Churches met on November 12th at the North Park Wesleyan Church. Reports were given as follows:



- ♦ The recent **CROP Walk** chaired by Ann Gross was very successful. Thank you to all who donated.
- ♦ Food Pantry requests for September 10th through October were 17 for food assistance (6 September, 11 October) and five for gas assistance (October). The majority of the food presently in the Pantry will be distributed through the Holiday Assistance Program (HAP), so congregations are asked to continue contributions, both to augment the HAP and to restock the shelves for the end of December and into 2024.
- ♦ An offering taken at the **Thanksgiving-Advent Service** will also go toward the HAP. The service will be held at the North Park Wesleyan Church starting at 6 p.m. on November 26th. Father John Cullen of Our Lady of Angels RC Church will offer the message. A time of refreshment and fellowship will follow the service.
- ♦ The Council members voted to support the Cuba Rushford Elementary PTO 'snack drive' request. Two hundred dollars will be given to the teachers to purchase snack items for those children who do not bring something from home.

Area church news included:

- ♦ The **First Baptist Church** has called the Rev. Tenorris 'TJ' Davis to the pulpit; he will preach on November 26th. Pastor Davis will be traveling between Cuba and his home in Indiana for up to a year while his wife completes her medical residency. The annual Holiday Market will be held on December 2nd and a dinner theater on December 17th. Initial roof repairs have been made with more repairs planned for spring.
- ♦ North Park Wesleyan has received two new members and held one infant dedication since September. The Wild Wednesday program has 37 students enrolled and is under the leadership of Brandt Hall. The Youth Group has 23 members, with an average attendance of 18. The Harvest Dinner maxed out the fellowship space with 140 attending! The foyer has been successfully and beautifully remodeled.
- ♦ Our Lady of Angels congregation is doing several in-house programs, including watching "The Chosen". The chicken barbeque held earlier in the year was a success.

The Council will meet again on January 14, 2024 at the First Baptist Church starting at 5 p.m.


